The Seagate Golf Club fully reopens following \$14.5 million renovation guided by Drew Rogers

The Seagate Golf Club in Palm Beach County, Florida, has opened its front nine holes, meaning all 18 holes are available for play following a \$14.5 million renovation. The back nine opened for play in December 2023.

Architect **Drew Rogers** oversaw the renovation of the **Joe Lee**-designed 18-hole championship golf course and practice facilities. The course, which winds through 120 acres of Bimini Bermudagrass and tree-lined fairways, closed in April 2023 for the project.

The transformation served to heighten the playability of each hole and, in some instances, resulted in complete redesigns. Greens, fairways, tees, bunkers, irrigation, drainage, turfgrasses, landscaping, and driving range and practice facilities were among the areas enhanced by the project.
